# EC Merit Scholarship

## General Information

Everest Collegiate High School is pleased to offer tuition credit and scholarship to high school students based on High School Placement Test (HSPT) scores. In collaboration with other high schools in the Archdiocese of Detroit, Everest Collegiate has chosen not to offer Scholastic Testing Service's HSPT to the Class of 2025. Everest has adapted its merit scholarship based on this decision, allowing the Class of 2025 to obtain merit scholarships based upon their PSAT 8/9 scoring. Scholarships are issued as tuition credits applicable to the tuition balance for the recipient only.

### **EC Merit Scholarship – Gold**

Criteria: Rank in 98th or 99th percentile on the PSAT 8/9.

For renewal, at least a 3.5 cumulative grade point average must be maintained in core classes.

The scholarship can be revoked by the principal for disciplinary infractions. (See the Everest Parent & Student Handbook.)

Award: \$2,000 freshman year  
\$2,000 sophomore year  
\$2,000 junior year  
\$2,000 senior year

Renewable: Yes, student can maintain the award level provided criteria are met.

### **EC Merit Scholarship – Silver**

Criteria: Rank in 96th or 97th percentile on the PSAT 8/9.

For renewal, at least a 3.4 cumulative grade point average must be maintained in core classes.

The scholarship can be revoked by the principal for disciplinary infractions. (See the Everest Parent & Student Handbook.)

Award: \$1,500 freshman year  
\$1,500 sophomore year  
\$1,500 junior year  
\$1,500 senior year

Renewable: Yes, student can maintain the award level provided criteria are met.

### **EC Merit Scholarship – Bronze**

Criteria: Rank in 94th or 95th percentile on the PSAT 8/9.

For renewal, at least a 3.3 cumulative grade point average must be maintained in core classes.

The scholarship can be revoked by the principal for disciplinary infractions. (See the Everest Parent & Student Handbook.)

Award: \$1,000 freshman year  
\$1,000 sophomore year  
\$1,000 junior year  
\$1,000 senior year

Renewable: Yes, student can maintain the award level provided criteria are met.
